Monica Vasquez was born in Miami, FL to Colombian parents. The quest for physical healing combined with her passion for knowledge and spiritual development guided her into becoming a Holistic Health Advocate, always learning different techniques and practices that promote wellbeing and integration of the mind, body, and spirit.

In 2012 she became a Usui Reiki Master, as well as an Ordained Minister; simultaneously, she started her path with sacred plant medicine, first as a participant, then a translator, and soon as part of the supporting team.
